Be sure that those courses will be offered at the host institution by looking at the program webpages for each program you are interested in. You will get Penn State credits and grades for the classes you take abroad. If you need additional information or help identifying courses that are available, contact the Education Abroad Adviser for the program you are interested in.

Courses Available in English

The language of instruction varies by program. Some programs offer language intensive courses, while other programs may offer a combination of courses taught in English as well as the host language.

We strongly encourage all students to take at least one course in the host language to assist them in acclimating to the host country and to begin to understand the cultural nuances of the host country. Some programs may require at least one language course.

Other Short-Term Programs in Spain

In addition to semester and summer programs, short-term embedded programs are an additional opportunity to study abroad. Embedded Programs are courses that are taught at Penn State, but include a brief international excursion as a minor component of a class.
