## **CIEE Seoul Arts and Sciences** Searching for Courses on the Yonsei Portal

First, please note that **you do not need to log-in to view the course offerings**. And please note that Yonsei does not upload the course offerings for each semester until a few weeks before the start of the semester. However, you can get an idea of what courses are generally offered by looking at what was offered in previous years. Some courses are offered every semester, while others are only offered in the spring and some only in the fall. Syllabi can be accessed by clicking the small purple arrow beside the course title. The syllabi often contain course descriptions and comments about prerequisites and requirements.


When studying the Yonsei Portal, you should keep in mind that the First Semester category is Spring Semester. This is because, in Korea, Spring Semester is the first semester of the school year; Fall is the second semester.

Also, courses taught in English are offered in many departments (including Engineering) and students can register for any of them, though some may have prerequisites (i.e. be a junior or senior, have had certain classes, have a certain major). Also, students can take many of the courses offered through the all-English Underwood International College, that is, UIC courses. However, some of them are exclusively for students enrolled in the Underwood International College. In some courses (i.e., business courses), only 5 or 10 seats are allocated for international students. **Business courses are open to only business majors.** 

**To view the courses,** go to the Yonsei portal site using the link provided here: http://portal.yonsei.ac.kr/main/indexe.jsp

Under the heading "The Main Portal Service" CLICK "Course Catalogue and Syllabus: Undergraduate & Graduate"

Wait for the page to appear. It will look something like the following:




Make sure the Semester boxes on the left side of the page denote the "year" and "semester term" that you are interested in. For example "2013" and "1st semester". In Korea, the 1<sup>st</sup> semester is equivalent to the Spring term at Penn State and the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester is equal to the Fall term at Penn State.

On the left side of the page where it says "Major", CLICK the drop down arrow and choose "Undergraduate Programs".

In the next box (which in the above screen shot says "University College"), CLICK the drop down arrow and choose "Study Abroad". Then, move to the right and CLICK the blue magnifying glass Wait 5 to 10 seconds or more and a lot of courses taught in English will appear. To see a course syllabus, CLICK the small purple arrow beside the course title. **Note: In the drop down menus, do not choose "International Campus", "Exchange Course", and "International Education and Exchange".** 

You can also choose "Underwood International College" from the same drop down menu, in which case in the box to the right (which in the above screen shot says "Open Major"), choose "International Division." Then, using the bottom scroll bar, move the screen all the way to the right. You should be able to see the words "Search All" with a box that says "Course Code"; type IEE in the box and click on the white magnifying glass beside the box (see the screen shot below). Wait 5 to 10 seconds or more and a lot of courses taught in English will appear. In the bottom right hand corner, click on the boxes with numbers (3, 4, & 5) and check the courses until you find the ones which say "20131" in the column titled "Semester" (see second screen shot below).



Another way to locate courses taught in English is to choose a college, for example, "College of Business and Economics." In the next box, choose "Economics"; CLICK the blue magnifying glass. Wait a few seconds and a lot of courses will appear. Scroll to the right and CLICK on the "English Course Only box;" the page will change to courses taught in English as indicated by a 2 in a circle in the "Reference" column (see screen shots below).
