ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENT

Study Abroad and Exchange students are required to have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.7 before we will accept them at Victoria University. If they have not achieved a minimum CGPA of 2.7 or higher (but they are very near the desired mark), we would still encourage them to apply, but their offer will probably be conditional upon gaining a CGPA of 2.7 or higher and providing full original/certified academic transcripts before they can receive an unconditional offer letter or enrol. If students are still not able to achieve CGPA of 2.7, request them to provide a reference letter and a statement of intent (stating the reason why they should still be considered for admission even they did not meet the requirement). We will reassess their application once these documents are received.

Postgraduate courses are available for Study Abroad and Exchange students who have the equivalent of a New Zealand Bachelor's degree. However, processing may take longer if they want to study a full time course load at postgraduate level (approx 4-6 weeks). Therefore, students are strongly encouraged to submit an application earlier. An offer will only be issued if students have at least three postgraduate courses being approved.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

Study Abroad and Exchange students often ask us to assess how much credit can be granted towards their home degree once they have completed their studies at Victoria University of Wellington. This is the decision of the home university and students need to check with their home university beforehand to work out how their courses at Victoria University will transfer back to their degree.

FACULTY OF ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN

Portfolio requirement: Students can only submit portfolio in a CD, PDF, in a proper booklet format or a website. Printouts are strongly discouraged. If students are applying for several ARCH/DESN courses, please make several copies of the portfolio (e.g. CD) so that the course approval process can be speed up (each course has different academic staff to assess them).

Some 'EPSY' courses are also not available to Study Abroad and Exchange students (e.g. EPSY 111). 1) Music – composition (CMPO) courses	To be considered for entry in to CMPO courses at 200-level or above, students must provide samples of their compositions. Students should provide two or three works that they feel are representative of the field of composition they are interested in studying at Victoria University. These can be provided electronically in PDF and/or MP3 format. Deadline: For Trimester 1, 2013 the samples of work must be received by 8 th October, 2012.
2) Music – performance (PERF) courses:	For consideration for entry in to any performance course, students must provide an Application for Audition Form along with the Study Abroad/Exchange Application Form. To download the application for audition form, please click on the following link: http://www.nzsm.ac.nz/downloads/Application%20Form%202008%20for%20Perf%202009%20WEBSITE.pdf . Students are also required to provide a DVD or recording of their audition and a NZ\$50 bank cheque/draft. DVD recordings will not be returned. Deadline: For Trimester 1 , 2013 the Application for Audition Form should be received by 1 st September and DVD by 8th October, 2012.
	PERF 251 – Pacific Islands Performance 1 does not require any additional material.
3) MUSC 166	Students interested in MUSC 166 may be required to show evidence that they have passed Grade 5 theory (Trinity, ABRSM, or AMEB) or successfully passed an equivalent test recognized by the New Zealand School of Music.
4) Creative Writing (CREW) courses	Creative Writing (CREW) courses are competitive and limited entry. To be considered for entry into CREW courses, students are required to complete an additional application form for desired CREW courses and submit this with a sample of their work. An application form can be downloaded from the following link: http://www.victoria.ac.nz/modernletters/student-help/publications/UG09_10application_form.pdf . Students should submit all of the documentation to Victoria International. It will then be forwarded to the International Institute of Modern Letters.
	Deadline: For Trimester 1, the additional application and sample work must be received by 1 December the year before. Notification of approval is given by mid-January. For Trimester 2 the additional application and sample work must be received by 1 May of the same year. Notification of approval is given by mid-June. All applications for CREW courses go through a selection process and are assessed as a bulk.

	Students should be aware that Victoria University's creative writing courses are not graded . Students receive an 'H' grade (ungraded pass) or 'F' (ungraded fail), along with written feedback from their workshop leader. We are aware that this has caused problems for some of our American students in the past. Students should double-check with their home university that they can credit ungraded courses to their degree.

	Contact the Victoria International Admissions team for a limited entry course form by 1 December of the previous year. The form needs to be filled out and submitted to Victoria International by 1 December of the previous year.	
6) 200-level language courses	Students who are applying for 200-level language courses or higher will probably need to have their proficiency assessed by the School/Faculty when they arrive in person.

Study Abroad and Exchange students are not allowed to enroll in LAWS 122, LAWS123, any 200-level (2 nd year) Law papers or in LAWS301. Students may enroll in the 300-level elective papers (except courses for which pre-requisites and co-requisites have been prescribed) and in no more than one 400-level Law seminar.
